Guelph Election Results – The Good News!

Although we didn’t win the riding of Guelph in the May 2nd national election, we made significant gains in terms of votes. Here are the results we’ve achieved since the Conservative Party was formed in 2003 and over the four federal elections that have been held since then, in 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2011.

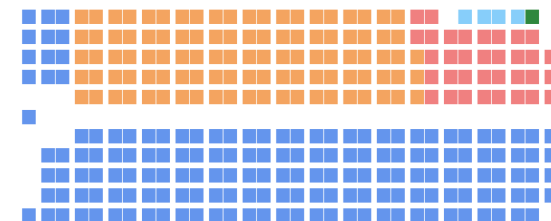
Year	Conservative Votes*	% Total Votes cast in Guelph*
2004	13,721	26.11%
2006	18,342	29.76%
2008	17,186	29.18%
2011	19,252	32.65%

In 2011, we received over 2000 more votes than we did in the previous election, which means the Conservative Party in Guelph has a terrific foundation for the next federal election in 2015!

Guelph Election Results – The Bad News!

When Frank Valeriote was re-elected, Guelph became a big loser. Guelph is now one of only 34 ridings represented by the remains of the Liberal Party. The Harper Government supported Guelph when it was a minority government and will continue to give it support now that it has a majority. But Guelph’s voice will be very small. In fact, it will be heard only rarely, and from a far back corner of Parliament. Do you know where Frank sits during Question Period?

**HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PRIME MINISTER'S SPEECH
AT THE JUNE 2011 NATIONAL CONVENTION IN OTTAWA
CELEBRATING THE MAY 2ND CONSERVATIVE VICTORY**

Here's a reminder of the key points and upcoming plans that Stephen Harper talked about in his speech to the convention delegates:

- We are driven by a moral obligation, not merely to do well, not only to do wisely, but to do what we have promised -- to act on the strong and clear mandate we received from the people of Canada.
- Within 100 sitting days of this majority Parliament, as promised, we shall combine our outstanding criminal justice bills -- measures the opposition has been blocking in some cases for years. We will put them into comprehensive legislation and we will pass them!
- We will bring in legislation this fall to finally scrap the costly and inefficient long-gun registry.
- We shall continue our long-term program to re-equip the Canadian Armed Forces with the tools they need. There will be new fighter jets when the current ones reach the end of their useful life later this decade. There will be new ships for the navy and for the coast guard, through our National Shipbuilding Strategy. And we shall continue to invest in the army.
- We Conservatives will give the men and women of the Canadian Armed Forces the equipment they need, and the respect they deserve! But re-equipping the military is just the tip of the iceberg. When it comes to making Canada a meaningful contributor in the world, we also have a purpose. And that purpose is no longer just to go along and get along with everyone else's agenda. We will take strong, principled positions in our dealings with other nations whether popular or not.
- As we have been reminded again in recent weeks, the global economy remains fragile. Our budget is our unshakeable commitment to focus on jobs and growth by keeping taxes down, by funding priorities, by eliminating fat, and by moving gradually but inexorably to eliminate the deficit!
- We will implement our other measures. On the environment and conservation. On the Wheat Board. On Senate reform, and on Commons representation. And, yes, on getting rid of that extravagant per-vote taxpayer subsidy for political parties!
- Our party's great purpose is nothing less than to prepare our nation to shoulder a bigger load, in a world that will require it of us. We campaigned on the new Canadian reality of this great country rising. It is a country founded on great principles. A courageous warrior, a compassionate neighbour, a confident partner. Under a strong, stable, national, majority Conservative government, Canada - the best country in the world!
